“Jesus said to him, ‘Go and do likewise.’”
 LUKE 10:37

This was Jesus’ command at the end of the Good Samaritan story. Did you know that the Samaritans and Jews despised each other. The moral of the story is to love our neighbor. That means loving someone you may not know or someone that looks different than you or someone that you don’t like. All without expecting anything in return.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses petitions the people to follow the commandments God has set before them. He reminds them that the laws are not in the sky or far away at sea, but are accessible to them and meant to be followed if they wish to prosper.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

Paul discusses the divine nature of Jesus, and explains that Jesus was created before anything else. Everything else was “created through him, and for him.”

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

While discussing everlasting life, a lawyer mentions loving one's neighbor as oneself. The lawyer then asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells him about a man beaten by robbers, who was ignored by both a priest and a Levite before a Samaritan stopped and offered him aid. Jesus asks the lawyer who was a neighbor to the injured man. The lawyer says "the one who treated him with compassion." Jesus encourages him to go and do the same.

**MISSION CO-OP COLLECTION

We are happy to welcome Rev. John Kadayil, from the Little Flower Congregation to St. Luke Parish for this year's Mission Appeal. He is a missionary working in the Transanian Mission. He is from the same order as Father George and Father Bijoy.

Congregation of St. Therese of Child Jesus (CST) is a missionary Religious Community, founded in India in 1931, under the heavenly patronage of St. Therese of Lisieux. The Motto of the Congregation is "Be Little, Serve the Little." The CST members are engaged in pastoral care, education, care for the orphans and people in distress and social development activities in Nepal, Papua New Guinea, Tanzania and Kenya as well as in India. They also render pastoral services in the U.S., Canada, Germany, France, England, Australia, etc.

The Congregation started its mission in Africa in 1999, in Mugumu, in the diocese of Musoma in Tanzania. Later we shifted to Songea. Presently nine priests are rendering pastoral care in the Archdioceses of Dar Es Salaam, Dodoma and Songea in Tanzania, and Diocese of Meru in Kenya. Our Parishes are situated in the rural areas. Every parish has three or more sub stations, each six to twenty miles away from the Parish Church. Mostly people are farmers, and at the mercy of rain. Faith Formation is our main challenge. Also we try to focus on education, vocational training and self- help programs.
